**Title**: "Rethinking how language 'goes to school': Social capital in teaching and learning new languages."



#### Abstract:

When language 'goes to school', a basic contradiction ensues: It stops functioning as language and becomes a subject matter. This lecture examines the problem in terms of social capital, and outlines how learning new languages involves developing new forms of capital although most classroom language teaching mediates against that development. Drawing from experiences as a language teacher and teacher educator, I will discuss pedagogical and program designs that work to bridge the gap.
