MODULE SELECTION ON MAP

A list of both elective and compulsory modules will be displayed and you must then press 'confirm selections' to finalise your elective module choices.

Once the Lectures have started you may change your selection only up to the end of the first week of the relevant term. Requests to change elective module selections can be done via MAP.
