

APPENDIX F - Academic Promotions Procedure

FELLOWS, SENIOR FELLOWS AND PRINCIPAL FELLOWS OF ADVANCE HE (FORMERLY THE HIGHER EDUCATION ACADEMY)

Fellow of the Advance HE Higher Education Academy (FHEA)

The status of FHEA is conferred by Advance HE, either directly or as a consequence of successful completion of an accredited programme of study, to individuals who are able to demonstrate achievement and success in all the dimensions of the UK professional standards framework for Higher Education. They are also expected to incorporate relevant subject and pedagogic research and/or scholarship into their professional practice.

Senior Fellow of the Advance HE Higher Education Academy (SFHEA)

The status of SFHEA is conferred by Advance HE, either directly or through the University's RITE programme, to individuals who have been recognised as having a considerable level of expertise, developed over time, in supporting high quality student learning - including evidence of their effective and significant impact on students, on colleagues and on the wider institution.

Principal Fellow of the Advance HE Higher Education Academy (PFHEA)

The status of PFHEA is conferred by Advance HE, either directly or through the University's RITE programme, to individuals who have been recognised as having substantial experience and knowledge of teaching and supporting learning and who are using this to make an impact at a senior level. Their work will normally include the effective strategic leadership of academic practice/development, often at a national or international level, leading to the development and implementation of high quality student learning experiences.

National Teaching Fellow (NTF)

The award of National Teaching Fellow (NTF) is conferred by Advance HE and recognises, rewards and celebrates individuals who have made an outstanding impact on student learning and the teaching profession. On gaining the award, each NTF has a role to support the enhancement of learning and teaching in both the institution and the sector. The award of NTF is widely recognised in the UK and internationally as difficult to achieve and a mark of quality. This is because institutions can only nominate three people each year to go forward and then awards are made from a very large number of nominations.
